Students meeting the general admission requirements of the University may be accepted as an undeclared major. Registration to music classes by undeclared student or student with a major other than music is subject to prerequisite and music major status restrictions as indicated in the UNC Catalog. Students can be designated as music majors and accepted by the School of Music after a successful audition and School of Music application.

**\*Minimum Proficiencies.** Minimum proficiency in music fundamentals and ear training as assessed by the Music Theory Placement Exam to enter MUS 113/114.

**Minor Required – No minor required.**

This worksheet is a recommended schedule to complete your bachelor’s degree in 4 years. Every UNC student must meet the following requirements in order to graduate with a bachelor’s degree: earn a minimum of 120 semester credit hours; possess a minimum of a 2.00 cumulative grade point average; have at least 40 credit hours in courses designated as Liberal Arts Core; meet all degree requirements in the student’s major field of study. Each major and/or emphasis may have additional requirements necessary for graduation. **Students must consult with their major advisor to receive information on any additional graduation requirements.**

**Notes**

1. MUS 100 Recitals, Concerts, and Productions must be taken each semester in residence.
2. Students must take Individual Performance during each semester in residence.
3. Students must take Major Musical Organizations during each semester in residence. See “Major Musical Organizations” in the UNC Catalog.
4. Wind and Percussion students must take a total of 2 credits of Marching Band (MUS 292/492). String majors, in consultation with their advisor, may opt to take 2 credits of music electives as part of the 50 Required Major credits.
5. MUS 143 may be taken fall semester of freshman year. Consult your advisor for best plan of action.
6. EDFE 110 PTEP Application must be taken the semester before MUS 210 Introduction to Music Education
7. The student must pass an upper-level qualifying examination, determined by the performance area, before he/she may enroll in the 400-level instruction. This examination is to be taken by the end of the fourth semester of 200-level instruction. If the student does not pass this examination on the first try, he/she may retake it once in the subsequent semester.
8. Students should consult with advisor to determine if they should take MUS 404 in the Fall of Senior year or Spring semester of Junior year.
9. All BME, Instrumental Music K-12 majors must take the Piano Placement Examination upon registering for their first semester to determine proficiency level and recommendations for further study, if any. BME Instrumental Music K-12 majors may take as few or as many piano classes (MUS 160, 161, 260 and 261, 271 and/or 471) as necessary to achieve the skills necessary to pass a mandatory Piano Proficiency Exam.
10. A half Senior Recital required.
