This worksheet is a recommended schedule to complete your bachelor's degree in 4 years. Every UNC student must meet the following requirements in order to graduate with a bachelor's degree: earn a minimum of 120 semester credit hours; possess a minimum of a 2.8 cumulative grade point average; have at least 40 credit hours in courses designated as Liberal Arts Core; meet all degree requirements in Art Design- Art 13-14

the student's major field of study. Each major and/or emphasis may have additional requirements necessary for graduation. **Students must consult with their major advisor to receive information on any additional graduation requirements.**

Notes

1. After successful acceptance of entry application, new Art & Design students must complete the Freshman Foundation requirements before they can begin their advance art studies. The Freshman Foundation Courses include Art 181, 182, 183, 184 and 234 which must be completed with a 3.0 GPA. Students also must successfully complete the Foundation Portfolio.
2. To graduate with a B.A. in Art & Design, all students must earn a 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher in all courses in the major, and a 2.8 GPA or higher for overall university coursework.
3. An exit level Senior Portfolio assessment is required prior to graduation. The portfolio consists of work from the student's concentration area. Students are evaluated on their knowledge and successful demonstration of: professional portfolio preparation of art work, art history and cultures, and verbal and written critical analysis.

The art emphasis is a liberal arts program designed to give students broad exposure to the studio arts and art history. It prepares the artist and craftsman. It is an ideal preparatory program for students planning to do advanced or graduate study in art and art history.
