<u>Need help registering for your 1st semester?</u>

Best resource for advising:

Login to URSA and click on DegreeWorks on the Student tab – this application shows your degree requirements and tracks what's been completed. It's more immediately helpful for MM and CERT students, and customized for DA students after two semesters, so it will become more helpful after the first year – however it will show you the structure of the degree. DA students – view the Plan of Study document for your structure.

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What's your status?

Part-time – below 4 credits Half-time – 4-8 credits Fulltime – 9 credits or more

Step 1: Register for your Lesson – Typically 2 credits

Step 2: Sign up for Ensemble Auditions – Ensembles are 1 credit

Sign up, using the Word Doc. attached to the email.

If you are a string player, it's safe to register for orchestra however, you still must audition

If your area is voice, brass, piano, etc – you have multiple ensemble options and should wait until assigned through the audition process. *Hold 1 credit in your schedule for your ensemble*.

Step 3: Sign up for an Academic Course

Typically: 1st year MM students register for MUS 600 (2 credits)

1st year DA students register for MUS 700 (3 credits)

Step 4: Reach 9 credits, if full-time

If your area is not offering a specific lecture this semester (i.e. a pedagogy course, repertoire/literature course, etc), you'll complete your course load with an additional theory or history (3 credits).

To take theory your 1st semester, you must pass the theory/aural skills entrance exams. You can sign up for any history you find interest in. After the history advisory exams, you will learn areas they feel you are deficient, with recommendations of courses to take while at UNC.

Optional Step 5: Electives

We offer many additional small ensembles, and non-required music electives. Check the listings on URSA – under course listings. Attached to this email is also a list of Music Electives for Grad Students.

Register this summer – do NOT wait to register for academic classes until the 1st week. All classes are held, with the exception of a few ensembles.
